	<u>d.</u>	within four months of the filing for the exemption; Has a net profit of at least two percent (2%) of its total assets for seven of the 10 years prior to issuance;
	<u>e.</u>	Has no delinquent federal or State taxes at the time of issuance;

<u>and</u>

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During the 10 years prior to issuance, has not filed for f. bankruptcy as a principal or as an agent or five percent (5%) equity owner in a partnership, limited liability company, limited partnership, or corporation.

Notes authorized for exemption under this subdivision may have maturities of up to five years. In no event may the aggregate outstanding amount of notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued under this subdivision or any other exemptions from registration under G.S. 78A-16 or G.S. 78A-17 exceed five million dollars (\$5,000,000) at any time. Proceeds from the sale of notes pursuant to this subdivision may not be used to pay the individual debts of the sole proprietor. partners, limited liability company members, or stockholders. Advertisements for notes authorized by this subdivision shall clearly state that the notes being offered are not guaranteed by any governmental agency. The applicant must provide authorization to the Administrator to verify the representation that there are no delinquent federal or State taxes. The Administrator shall review any proposal for exemption under this subdivision within 10 business days of receipt, and no securities may be exempted under this subdivision without the approval of the Administrator. If the Administrator does not approve a proposal for exemption under this subdivision, the Administrator shall, within 30 days of the Administrator's refusal to approve the exemption, provide the applicant with a written statement detailing the reasons for the Administrator's refusal to approve the exemption. A proposal for exemption under this subdivision shall include copies of all advertisements to be used for the notes. The Administrator may adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section and may establish a fee to recover the administrative cost of reviewing a proposal under this subdivision, not to exceed one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00)."

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995.
