A JOINT RESOLUTION DEMANDING THAT THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT 1 2 CEASE AND DESIST MANDATES THAT ARE BEYOND THE SCOPE OF ITS 3 CONSTITUTIONALLY DELEGATED POWERS. 4 Whereas, the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States reads 5 as follows: "The powers not delegated to the United States by the constitution, nor prohibited by 6 7 it to the states, are reserved to the states, respectively, or to the people."; and Whereas, the Tenth Amendment defines the total scope of federal power as 8 being that specifically granted by the United States Constitution and no more; and 9 10 Whereas, the scope of power defined by the Tenth Amendment means that the federal government was created by the states specifically to be an agent of the states; 11 12 and 13 Whereas, in 1995, the states are in fact treated as agents of the federal government; and 14 Whereas, many federal mandates are directly in violation of the Tenth 15 Amendment to the Constitution of the United States; and 16 17 Whereas, the United States Supreme Court has ruled in New York v. United States, 112 S. Ct. 2408 (1992), that Congress may not simply commandeer the 18 legislative and regulatory processes of the states; and 19

Whereas, a number of proposals from previous administrations and some now
pending from the present administration and from Congress may further violate the
United States Constitution;
Now, therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring:
Section 1. That the State of North Carolina claims sovereignty under the
Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States over all other powers not
otherwise enumerated and granted to the federal government by the United States
Constitution.
Sec. 2. That this serve as Notice and Demand to the federal government, as
the State of North Carolina's agent, to cease and desist, effective immediately, mandates
that are beyond the scope of its constitutionally delegated powers.
Sec. 3. The Secretary of State shall transmit copies of this resolution to the
President of the United States, the Vice President of the United States, the Speaker of
the United States House of Representatives, the President of the United States Senate,
the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate of each
state lagislature of the United States and each constor and representative in the

- 18 Sec. 4. This resolution is effective upon ratification.
