1 A JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE ONE HUNDREDTH YEAR OF 2 WOMEN SERVING IN STATE LEGISLATURES AND THE MANY CONTRIBUTIONS WOMEN SERVING OR FORMERLY SERVING, IN 3 VARIOUS CAPACITIES IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF 4 NORTH CAROLINA HAVE MADE TO OUR LEGISLATIVE PROCESS, AND 5 HONORING NORTH CAROLINA'S WOMEN LEGISLATORS WHO ARE NOW 6 DECEASED. 7

8 Whereas, the National Foundation for Women Legislators, Inc., which serves 9 as the educational arm of the National Order of Women Legislators, the oldest 10 professional association for women legislators in the country, is coordinating state, 11 regional, and national celebrations to commemorate the 100th year of women serving in 12 state legislatures; and

Whereas, women state legislators were elected to serve before Americanwomen had the universal right to vote; and

15 Whereas, in January 1895, the first three women were sworn in to serve as 16 state legislators; and

17 Whereas, the members of the General Assembly recognize the 100th year of 18 women in state legislatures; and

Whereas, the General Assembly proudly recognizes the women who are currently serving and the women who have formerly served in the legislature from across the State for their outstanding contributions and accomplishments as America's true "Timeless Pioneers"; and

35	women named above who are currently serving in the General Assembly and to the
36	National Foundation for Women Legislators, Inc.
37	Sec. 4. This resolution is effective upon ratification.
