3	BECAUSE (OF OBSERVANCE OF A RELIGIOUS HOLIDAY TO CAST AN
4	ABSENTEE	BALLOT.
5	The General Asso	embly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section	n 1. G.S. 163-226(a) reads as rewritten:
7	"(a) Who N	Aay Vote Absentee Ballot; Generally. – Any qualified voter of the State
8	may vote by ab	sentee ballot in a statewide primary, general, or special election on
9	constitutional an	nendments, referenda or bond proposals, and any qualified voter of a
10	county is authori	zed to vote by absentee ballot in any primary or election conducted by
11	the county board	of elections, in the manner provided in this Article if:
12	(1)	He The voter expects to be absent from the county in which he is
13		registered during the entire period that the polls are open on the day of
14		the specified election in which he the voter desires to vote; or
15	(2)	He <u>The voter</u> is unable to be present at the voting place to vote in person
16		on the day of the specified election in which he the voter desires to vote
17		because of his the voter's sickness or other physical disability; or
18	(3)	He The voter is incarcerated, whether in his the voter's county of
19		residence or elsewhere, shall be entitled to vote by absentee ballot in the
20		county of his-the voter's residence in any election, specified herein, in

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1	which he the voter otherwise would be entitled to vote. Absentee voting
2	shall be in the same manner as provided in this Article. The chief
3	custodian or superintendent of the institution or other place of
4	confinement shall certify that the applicant is not a felon, and the
5	certification shall be as prescribed by the State Board of Elections. The
6	State Board of Elections is authorized to prescribe procedures to carry
7	out the intent and purpose of this subsection;
8	(3a) The voter because of the observance of a religious holiday pursuant to
9	the tenets of the voter's religion will be unable to cast a ballot at the
10	polling place on the day of the election; or
11	(4) <u>He-The voter is an employee of the county board of elections and his-the</u>
12	voter's assigned duties on the day of the election will cause him-the
13	voter to be unable to be present at the voting place to vote in person and
14	provided such employee has his the application witnessed by the
15	chairman of the county board of elections."
16	Sec. 2. G.S. 163-227(a)(1) reads as rewritten:
17	"(1) A voter expecting to be absent from the county of his residence all day
18	on the day of the specified election. election, or who is otherwise
19	entitled to cast an absentee ballot under G.S. 163-226(a)(3), 163-
20	<u>226(a)(3a) or 163-226(a)(4).</u> (G.S. 163-226(a) (1))."
21	Sec. 3. G.S. 163-227(b)(1) reads as rewritten:
22	"(1) Expected Absence from County on Election Day.Day, or other
23	Permitted Reason A voter expected to be absent from the county in
24	which registered during the entire period that the polls will be open on
25	primary or general election day, or a near relative, or verifiable legal
26	guardian, shall make written application for absentee ballots to the
27	chairman of the board of elections of the county in which the voter is
28	registered not earlier than 50 days nor later than 5:00 P.M. on the
29	Tuesday before the election. The application shall be submitted in the
30	form set out in this subdivision upon a copy which shall be furnished
31	the voter or a near relative by the chairman of the county board of
32	elections. The provisions of this subdivision also apply with respect to
33	persons entitled to vote by absentee ballot under G.S. 163-226(a)(3),
34	<u>163-226(a)(3a), or 163-226(a)(4).</u>
35	The applicant shall sign his application personally, or it shall be
36	signed by a near relative or verifiable legal guardian. The application
37	shall be signed in the presence of a witness, who shall sign his name in
38	the place provided on the form. The application form when properly
39	filled out shall be transmitted by mail or delivered in person by the
40	applicant or a near relative to the chairman or the supervisor of elections
41	of the county board of elections."
42	Sec. 4. G.S. 163-227.2(a) reads as rewritten:

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1	"(a) A person expecting to be absent from the county in which he is registered
2	during the entire period that the polls are open on the day of an election in which
3	absentee ballots are authorized or is eligible under G.S. 163-226(a)(2) G.S. 163-
4	<u>226(a)(2), 163-226(a)(3a), or G.S.</u> 163-226(a)(4) may request an application for absentee
5	ballots, complete the application, receive the absentee ballots, vote and deliver them
6	sealed in a container-return envelope to the county board of elections in the county in
7	which he is registered under the provisions of this section."
8	Sec. 5. G.S. 163-229(b)(2) reads as rewritten:
9	"(2) On the other side shall be printed the return address of the chairman of
10	the county board of elections and the following certificate:
11	'Certificate of Absentee or Sick VoterState of
12	County ofI,, do certify that I am a resident and
13	registered voter in precinct, County, North Carolina; that on the day of an
14	election,, 19 (check whichever of the following statements is correct.)
15	[] I will be absent from the county in which I reside.
16	[] Due to sickness or physical disability, or incarceration as a
17	misdemeanant, I will be unable to travel to the voting place in the
18	precinct in which I reside.
19	[] Due to the observance of a religious holiday pursuant to the
20	tenets of my religion, I will be unable to cast a ballot at the
21	polling place on the day of the election.
22	I further certify that I made application for absentee
23	ballots, and that I marked the ballots enclosed herein, or that they
24	were marked for me in my presence and according to my
25	instructions. I understand it is a felony to falsely sign this
26	certificate.
