A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1  
2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL FOR THE  
3 ARMY NATIONAL GUARD SHALL SERVE IN THE MILITARY POSITION OF  
4 BRIGADIER GENERAL - LINE, DEPUTY, STATE AREA COMMAND (STARC)  
5 COMMANDER.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Section 1. G.S. 127A-19 reads as rewritten:

8 "**§ 127A-19. Adjutant General.**

9 The military head of the militia shall be the Adjutant General who shall hold the rank  
10 of major general. The Adjutant General shall be appointed by the Governor in his  
11 capacity as commander in chief of the militia, in consultation with the Secretary of Crime  
12 Control and Public Safety, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. No person  
13 shall be appointed as Adjutant General who has less than five years' commissioned  
14 service in an active status in any component of the armed forces of the United States. The  
15 Adjutant General, while holding such office, may be a member of the active national  
16 guard or naval militia.

17 Subject to the approval of the Governor and in consultation with the Secretary,  
18 Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, the Adjutant General may appoint a  
19 deputy adjutant general for ~~army national guard~~ Army National Guard, an assistant  
20 adjutant general for Army National Guard, and an assistant adjutant general for ~~air~~

1 ~~national guard, both~~ Air National Guard, each of whom may hold the rank of brigadier  
2 general and who shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. The assistant adjutant  
3 general for Army National Guard shall also serve in the military position of Brigadier  
4 General - Line, Deputy, State Area Command (STARC) Commander. The Adjutant  
5 General may also employ such staff members and other personnel as may be authorized  
6 by the Secretary and funded."

7           Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
