4	The Gen	eral As	sembly of North Carolina enacts:
5		Section	on 1. G.S. 66-58(c) reads as rewritten:
6	"(c)	The p	provisions of subsection (a) shall not prohibit:
7		(1)	The sale of products of experiment stations or test farms.
8		(2)	The sale of learned journals, works of art, books or publications of the
9			Department of Cultural Resources or other agencies, or the Supreme
10			Court Reports or Session Laws of the General Assembly.
11		(3)	The business operation of endowment funds established for the purpose
12			of producing income for educational purposes; for purposes of this
13			section, the phrase "operation of endowment funds" shall include the
14			operation by public postsecondary educational institutions of campus
15			stores, the profits from which are used exclusively for awarding
16			scholarships to defray the expenses of students attending the institution;
17			provided, that the operation of such stores must be approved by the
18			board of trustees of the institution, and the merchandise sold shall be
19			limited to educational materials and supplies, gift items and
20			miscellaneous personal-use articles. Provided further that sales at

1		campus stores are limited to employees of the institution and members
2		of their immediate families, to duly enrolled students of the campus at
3		•
		which a campus store is located and their immediate families, to duly
4		enrolled students of other campuses of the University of North Carolina
5		other than the campus at which the campus store is located, to other
6		campus stores and to other persons who are on campus other than for
7		the purpose of purchasing merchandise from campus stores. It is the
8		intent of this subdivision that campus stores be established and operated
9		for the purpose of assuring the availability of merchandise described in
10		this Article for sale to persons enumerated herein and not for the
11		purpose of competing with stores operated in the communities
12		surrounding the campuses of the University of North Carolina.
13	(4)	The operation of lunch counters by the Department of Human
14		Resources as blind enterprises of the type operated on January 1, 1951,
15		in State buildings in the City of Raleigh.
16	(5)	The operation of a snack bar and cafeteria in the State Legislative
17		Building.
18	(6)	The maintenance by the prison system authorities of eating and sleeping
19		facilities at units of the State prison system for prisoners and for
20		members of the prison staff while on duty, or the maintenance by the
21		highway system authorities of eating and sleeping facilities for working
22		crews on highway construction or maintenance when actually engaged
23		in such work on parts of the highway system.
24	(7)	The operation by penal, correctional or facilities operated by the
25		Department of Human Resources or by the State Department of
26		Agriculture, of dining rooms for the inmates or clients or members of
27		the staff while on duty and for the accommodation of persons visiting
28		such inmates or clients, and other bona fide visitors.
29	(8)	The sale by the Department of Agriculture of livestock, poultry and
30		publications in keeping with its present livestock and farm program.
31	(9)	The operation by the public schools of school cafeterias.
32	(10)	Sale by any State correctional or other institution of farm, dairy,
33		livestock or poultry products raised or produced by it in its normal
34		operations as authorized by the act creating it.
35	(11)	The sale of textbooks, library books, forms, bulletins, and instructional
36	()	supplies by the State Board of Education, State Department of Public
37		Instruction, and local school authorities.
38	(12)	The sale of North Carolina flags by or through the auspices of the
39	(1-)	Department of Administration, to the citizens of North Carolina.

41	(15)	programs on State-owned lands, including the sale on the open market
