A HOUSE RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE THE VOTE HISTORY FOR EACH BILL ON THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY'S INTERNET/WORLD WIDE WEB SITE IN THE MOST COMPLETE AND USEFUL FORMAT POSSIBLE.

Whereas, the members of the House of Representatives acknowledge that we are elected to represent the voters of our District and are accountable to them for our actions; and

Whereas, we believe that voters are entitled to be as informed as possible concerning our actions on their behalf; and

Whereas, the Internet provides a means by which information can be accessed on demand by the general public; and

Whereas, the General Assembly, through its Legislative Services Office's Information Systems Division, maintains a World Wide Web site on the Internet; and

Whereas, the General Assembly's web site provides, for each bill introduced, some information, including one version of the bill's test, a bill history report, and fiscal note information; and

Whereas, a complete voting history and complete information for each bill, including the wording of amendments or various committee substitutes that exist at different times, is not provided on the General Assembly's web site, and in order to obtain even a partial voting history for a particular bill, a person with Internet access must view the voting record of every individual legislator; and

Whereas, the current presentation makes it difficult for someone interested in a particular issue to determine what actions were taken on that issue and by whom; and

Section 2. The House of Representatives asks that this information be provided for all bills introduced this session at the earliest possible date and that this information be posted in future sessions in as timely a manner as is feasible.

Section 3. The Principal Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Legislative Services Officer and to the Director of the Information Systems Division.
