3	SALE OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE

5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 143-64.02 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 143-64.02. Definitions.
8	As used in Part 1 of this Article, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:
9	(1) 'Agency' means an existing department, institution, commission,
10	committee, board, division, or bureau of the State.
11	(2) 'Nonprofit tax exempt organizations' means those nonprofit tax exempt
12	medical institutions, hospitals, clinics, health centers, school systems,
13	schools, colleges, universities, schools for the mentally retarded, schools
14	for the physically handicapped, radio and television stations licensed by
15	the Federal Communications Commission as educational radio or
16	educational television stations, public libraries, and civil defense
17	organizations, that have been certified by the Internal Revenue Service
18	as tax-exempt nonprofit organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the
19	United States Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

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1	(3) <u>'Recyclable material' means a recyclable material, as defined in G.S.</u>
2	130A-290, that the Secretary of Administration determines, consistent
3	with G.S. 130A-309.14, to be a recyclable material."
4	Section 2. G.S. 143-64.05 reads as rewritten:
5	"§ 143-64.05. Warehousing, transfer, etc., charges. Service charges for disposal of
6	surplus property and recyclables; use of receipts from sale of surplus
7	property and recyclable material.
8	(a) The State agency for surplus property may assess and collect <u>a</u> service <u>charge</u>
9	charges or fees for the acquisition, receipt, warehousing, distribution distribution, or
10	transfer of any State surplus property. property and for the transfer or sale of recyclable
11	material.
12	(b) All receipts from the transfer or sale of surplus, obsolete, or unused equipment
13	of State departments, institutions, and agencies, agencies that are supported by
14	appropriations from the General Fund, except where the receipts have been anticipated
15	for, for or budgeted against the cost of replacements, shall be credited by the Secretary to
16	the Office of State Treasurer, Nontax Revenues. Treasurer as nontax revenue.
17	(c) <u>A department, institution, or agency may retain receipts derived from the</u>
18	transfer or sale of recyclable material, less any charge collected pursuant to subsection (a)
19	of this section, and may use the receipts to defray the costs of its recycling activities. A
20	contract for the transfer or sale of recyclable material to which a department, institution,
21	or agency is a party shall not become effective until the contract is approved by the
22	Secretary of Administration. The Secretary of Administration shall adopt rules governing
23	the transfer or sale of recyclable material by a department, institution, or agency and
24	specifying the conditions and procedures under which a department, institution, or
25	agency may retain the receipts derived from the transfer or sale, including the appropriate
26	allocation of receipts when more than one department, institution, or agency is involved
27	in a recycling activity."
