2	AN ACT TO ALLOW TWO MEMBERS OF THE VICTIM'S FAMILY TO BE
3	PRESENT AT AN EXECUTION.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 15-190 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 15-190. Person or persons to be designated by warden to execute sentence;
7	supervision of execution; who shall be present.
8	Some guard or guards or other reliable person or persons to be named and designated
9	by the warden from time to time shall cause the person, convict or felon against whom
10	the death sentence has been so pronounced to be executed as provided by this Article and
11	all amendments thereto. The execution shall be under the general supervision and control
12	of the warden of the penitentiary, who shall from time to time, in writing, name and
13	designate the guard or guards or other reliable person or persons who shall cause the
14	person, convict or felon against whom the death sentence has been pronounced to be
15	executed as provided by this Article and all amendments thereto. At such execution there
16	shall be present the warden or deputy warden or some person designated by the warden in
17	his stead; the warden's place, and the surgeon or physician of the penitentiary penitentiary.

19	relatives of such person, convict or felon and a minister or ministers of the gospel may be
