2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE POWERS AND AUTHORITY OF THE NORTH
3	CAROLINA NATIONAL GUARD.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 127A-149 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 127A-149. Power of arrest in certain emergencies.
7	In the event members of the North Carolina national guard or State defense militia are
8	called out by the Governor pursuant to the authority vested in him by the Constitution,
9	they shall have such power of arrest as may be reasonably necessary to accomplish the
10	purpose for which they have been called out.
11	While in active service of the State during a natural disaster or civil disturbance, or
12	imminent danger thereof, or while performing assigned duties as a member of the Joint
13	Counterdrug Task Force, members of the North Carolina national guard shall, unless
14	otherwise restricted by the executive orders or regulations or the orders of their
15	commander, have all of the powers and authority of peace officers, including the powers
16	to make arrests, to perform searches and seizures, to execute criminal warrants, and to
17	exercise any other powers and duties of law enforcement officers as are reasonably
18	necessary to preserve the lives, property, and security of persons in the subject civil
19	jurisdiction, or to participate in drug interdiction and counterdrug activities as authorized

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1	by 32 U.S.C. §112, all in accordance with the laws and constitutions of North Carolina
2	and the United States of America."
3	Section 2. G.S. 127A-150(b) reads as rewritten:
4	"(b) Whenever members of the North Carolina national guard or State defense
5	militia are called upon to execute the laws, engage in disaster relief, suppress or prevent
6	actual or threatened riot or insurrection, repel invasion, apprehend or disburse-disperse
7	any sniper, rioters, mob or unlawful assembly, or participate in drug interdiction and
8	counterdrug activities as authorized by 32 U.S.C. § 112, they shall have the immunities of
9	a law-enforcement officer."
10	Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
