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1 Section 3. The Department of Community Colleges, the University of North 2 Carolina at Chapel Hill, and the Board of Dental Examiners are directed, under their 3 statutory and independent powers, to consider developing dental hygiene education and 4 training programs that include night classes, remote teleconferencing, and other 5 reasonable measures, consistent with the standards set by the Commission of Dental 6 Accreditation, to assist dental hygiene students who desire or need to continue their 7 employment while they attend school.

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Section 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
