2	AN ACT TO ENSURE THAT DEALER PLATES ARE USED ONLY ON VEHICLES				
3	DRIVEN FOR A BUSINESS PURPOSE OF THE DEALERSHIP AND TO LIMIT				
4	THE NUMBER OF TRANSPORTER PLATES THAT MAY BE ISSUED TO A				
5	DEALER.				
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
7	Section 1. G.S. 20-79(d) reads as rewritten:				
8	"(d) Rest	rictions on Use. – A dealer license plate may be displayed only on a motor			
9	vehicle that meets all of the following requirements:				
10	(1)	Is part of the inventory of the dealer.			
11	(2)	Is not consigned to the dealer.			
12	(3)	Is covered by liability insurance that meets the requirements of Article			
13		9A of this Chapter.			
14	(4)	Is not used by the dealer in another business in which the dealer is			
15		engaged.			
16	(5)	Is driven on a highway by a person who meets the following requirements			
17		and who-carries a copy of the registration card for the dealer plates			
18		issued to the dealer and any demonstration permit issued to that person

1	(7) To move a mobile office, a mobile classroom, or a mobile or			
2	manufactured home.			
3	(8) To drive a motor vehicle that is at least 25 years old to and from a			
4	parade or another public event and to drive the motor vehicle in that			
5	event. A person who owns a motor vehicle that is at least 25 years old is			
6	considered to be in the business of collecting those vehicles.			
7	(9) To drive a motor vehicle that is part of the inventory of a dealer to and			
8	from a motor vehicle trade show or exhibition or to, during, and from a			
9	parade in which the motor vehicle is used.			
10	(10) To drive special mobile equipment in any of the following			
11	circumstances:			
12	a. From the manufacturer of the equipment to a facility of a dealer.			
13	b. From one facility of a dealer to another facility of a dealer.			
14	c. From a dealer to the person who buys the equipment from the			
15	dealer.			
16	(b) How to Get a Plate. – A person may obtain a transporter plate by filing an			
17	application with the Division and paying the required fee. An application must be on a			
18	form provided by the Division and contain the information required by the Division. The			
19	fee for a transporter plate is one-half the fee set in G.S. 20-87(5) for a passenger motor			
20	vehicle of not more than 15 passengers.			
21	(b1) <u>Number of Plates. – The total number of transporter and dealer plates issued to</u>			
22	a dealer may not exceed the number of dealer plates that can be issued to the dealer under			
23	G.S. 20-79(b). This restriction does not apply to a person who is not a dealer.			
24	Transporter plates issued to a dealer shall bear the words 'Dealer-Transporter.'			
25	(b2) <u>Sanctions. – The following sanctions apply when a motor vehicle displaying a</u>			
26	'Dealer-Transporter' license plate is driven in violation of the restrictions on the use of the			
27	<u>plate:</u>			
28	(1) The individual driving the motor vehicle is responsible for an infraction			
29	and is subject to a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50.00).			
30	(2) The dealer to whom the plate is issued is subject to a civil penalty			
31	imposed by the Division of two hundred dollars (\$200.00).			
32	(3) The Division may rescind all dealer license plates issued to the dealer			
33	whose plate was displayed on the motor vehicle.			
34	<u>A penalty imposed under subdivision (1)</u> of this subsection is payable to the			
35	county where the infraction occurred, as required by G.S. 14-3.1. A civil penalty imposed			
36	under subdivision (2) of this subsection shall be credited to the Highway Fund as nontax			
37	revenue.			
38	(c) Form, Duration, and Transfer. – A transporter plate is a type of commercial			
39	license plate. A transporter plate issued to a dealer is issued on a fiscal-year basis. A			
40	transporter plate issued to a person who is not a dealer is issued on a calendar-year basis.			
41	During the calendar-year for which it is issued, a person may transfer a transporter plate			
42	from one vehicle to another as long as the vehicle is driven only for a purpose authorized			
43	by subsection (a) of this section. The Division may rescind a transporter plate that is			

- displayed on a motor vehicle driven for a purpose that is not authorized by subsection (a)
 of this section."
- 3 Section 3. Notwithstanding G.S. 20-79.2(c), as amended by this act, a 4 transporter plate issued to a dealer for the 1997 calendar year expires June 30, 1998.
- 5 Section 4. This act becomes effective January 1, 1998.
