G.S. 143B-181.10(c) reads as rewritten: Respite care services provided by the programs established by this section may (1) Counseling and training in the caregiving role, including coping mechanisms and behavior modification techniques; (2) Counseling and accessing available local, regional, and State services; (3) Support group development and facilitation; (4) Assessment and care planning for the patient of the caregiver; (5) Attendance and companion services for the patient in order to provide
	release time to the caregiver; (6) Personal care services, including meal preparation, for the patient of the caregiver; (7) Temporarily placing the person out of his home to provide the caregiver total respite when the mental or physical stress on the caregiver

necessitates this type of respite.

- 1 Program funds may provide no more than the current adult care reimbursement rate for out of
- 2 home placement. An out of home placement is defined as placement in a hospital, skilled
- 3 or intermediate nursing facility, adult care home, adult day health center, or adult day
- 4 care center. Duration of the service period may extend beyond a year."
- 5 Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
