- 9 BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION.
- 10 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. The Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources 11 shall not take any enforcement action against any person for any unintentional and 12 nonnegligent violation of water quality standards that are identified in the course of any 13 of the research studies directed by Sections 27.3 (odor control technology), 27.7 14 (groundwater impacts of lagoons), 27.9 (atmospheric deposition of nitrogen in the Neuse 15 Estuary), 27.32(b) (sources of nitrogen through isotope markers and other topics), and 16 27.35 (alternative animal waste technologies) of Chapter 18 of the 1995 Session Laws 17 (Second Extra Session). This section shall not be construed to limit an enforcement 18 action for any negligent or intentional act or for any violation that poses an immediate 19

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threat to public health or the environment. This section shall not be construed to relieve
any person from any duty otherwise imposed by law to take remedial or corrective action
to correct the violation.

4 Section 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 143-215.10E(a), an 5 employee of a State agency or unit of local government who identifies an unintentional or 6 nonnegligent violation listed in subdivisions (1) through (4) of G.S. 143-215.10E(a) that 7 is identified in the course of any of the research studies listed in Section 1 of this act is 8 not required to report the violation to the Division of Water Quality of the Department of 9 Environment, Health, and Natural Resources.

10 Section 3. The Primary Investigator or Researcher for each of the research 11 studies listed in Section 1 of this act shall report to the Environmental Review 12 Commission on the progress of the research study and on any preliminary results of the 13 research study on 1 January and 1 July of each year, beginning 1 July 1997, until the 14 research study is concluded. The Primary Investigator shall make a final report, 15 including final results and any recommendations, to the Environmental Review 16 Commission at the conclusion of the research study.

Section 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
