Section 1. G.S. 1-567.31(b) reads as rewritten:

The provisions of this Article Article, except G.S. 1-567.38 and G.S. 1-567.39, G.S. 1-567.38, 1-567.39, and 1-567.65, apply only if the place of arbitration is in this State."

Section 2. G.S. 1-567.48 reads as rewritten:

"§ 1-567.48. Equal treatment of parties, parties; representation by attorney.

The parties shall be treated with equality and each party shall be given a full 15 16 opportunity to present its case.
