AN ACT TO PROVIDE A ONE-YEAR WAITING PERIOD BEFORE FORMER LEGISLATORS MAY BECOME LOBBYISTS.

Section 1. Article 9A of Chapter 120 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 120-47.5A. Waiting period before former legislators may lobby.

Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 120-47.8, no individual who has served as a member of the General Assembly may act as a lobbyist as defined in this Article within one year after the expiration of the term for which the individual was elected or appointed to serve as a member of the General Assembly."

Section 2. G.S. 120-47.2(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) The form of the registration shall be prescribed by the Secretary of State and shall include the registrant's full name, firm, and complete address; the registrant's place of business; the full name and complete address of each person by whom the registrant is employed or retained; an indication of whether the registrant has served as a member of the General Assembly and the period served; and a general description of the matters on which the registrant expects to act as a lobbyist."

Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to individuals who serve terms beginning on or after January 1, 1997.
