2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE NORTH CAROLINA FINANCIAL PRIVACY ACT TO 3 PERMIT THE DISCLOSURE OF THE NAME, ADDRESS, ACCOUNT

- 4 NUMBER, AND TYPE OF ACCOUNT OF ANY CUSTOMER.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
 - Section 1. G.S. 53B-8 reads rewritten:

7 "§ 53B-8. Disclosure of financial records.

No financial institution or its officer, employee, or agent may disclose a customer's 8 9 financial record to a government authority except as provided in this Chapter. This section does not prohibit a financial institution from giving notice of or disclosing a 10 financial record to a government authority, as defined in G.S. 53B-2(4), to the same 11 extent as is authorized with respect to federal government authorities in the Right to 12 Financial Privacy Act § 1103(d), 12 U.S.C. § 3403(d). Nothing in this Chapter shall 13 prohibit a financial institution or its officer, employee, or agent from disclosing the 14 name, address, account number, and type of account of any customer or from notifying 15 a government authority that the financial institution or its officer, employee, or agent 16 has information that may be relevant to a possible violation of law or regulation. The 17 information shall be limited to a description of the suspected illegal activity and the 18 name or other identifying information concerning any individual, corporation, or 19 account involved in the activity. Any financial institution or its officer, employee, or 20 agent making a disclosure of information pursuant to this section shall not be liable to 21 22 the customer under the laws and rules of the State of North Carolina or any political subdivision of the State for disclosure or for failure to notify the customer of the 23 disclosure." 24
