AN ACT TO AMEND THE NORTH CAROLINA FINANCIAL PRIVACY ACT TO PERMIT THE DISCLOSURE OF THE NAME, ADDRESS, AND TYPE OF ACCOUNT OF ANY CUSTOMER.

Section 1. G.S. 53B-8 reads as rewritten:

"§ 53B-8. Disclosure of financial records.

No financial institution or its officer, employee, or agent may disclose a customer's financial record to a government authority except as provided in this Chapter. This section does not prohibit a financial institution from giving notice of or disclosing a financial record to a government authority, as defined in G.S. 53B-2(4), to the same extent as is authorized with respect to federal government authorities in the Right to Financial Privacy Act § 1103(d), 12 U.S.C. § 3403(d). Nothing in this Chapter shall prohibit a financial institution or its officer, employee, or agent from disclosing to a government authority the name, address, and existence of an account of any customer or from notifying a government authority that the financial institution or its officer, employee, or agent has information that may be relevant to a possible violation of law or regulation. The information shall be limited to a description of the suspected illegal activity and the name or other identifying information concerning any individual,

- 1 corporation, or account involved in the activity. Any financial institution or its officer,
- 2 employee, or agent making a disclosure of information pursuant to this section shall not
- 3 be liable to the customer under the laws and rules of the State of North Carolina or any
- 4 political subdivision of the State for disclosure or for failure to notify the customer of the
- 5 disclosure."
- 6 Section 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1997.
