- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
  - Section 1. G.S. 105-164.14(c) reads as rewritten:

Certain Governmental Entities. - A governmental entity listed in this 7 "(c) subsection is allowed an annual refund of sales and use tax paid by it under this Article, 8 except under G.S. 105-164.4(a)(4a) and G.S. 105-164.4(a)(4c), on direct purchases of 9 tangible personal property. Sales and use tax liability indirectly incurred by a 10 governmental entity on building materials, supplies, fixtures, and equipment that become 11 a part of or annexed to any building or structure that is owned or leased by the 12 governmental entity and is being erected, altered, or repaired for use by the governmental 13 entity is considered a sales or use tax liability incurred on direct purchases by the 14 governmental entity for the purpose of this subsection. A request for a refund must be in 15 writing and must include any information and documentation required by the Secretary. 16 A request for a refund is due within six months after the end of the governmental entity's 17 fiscal year. 18
