S 1 SENATE BILL 997 Short Title: Ignore Emergency Warning. (Public) Sponsors: Senators Plyler; and Conder. Referred to: Judiciary. April 21, 1997 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON WHO IGNORES A WARNING REGARDING PERSONAL SAFETY IN A DISASTER SITUATION AND PLACES HIMSELF OR HERSELF OR ANOTHER IN DANGER AND REQUIRES AN EMERGENCY RESCUE IS GUILTY OF A CLASS 2 MISDEMEANOR AND IS ALSO CIVILLY LIABLE FOR THE COSTS OF THE RESCUE EFFORT. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Article 36A of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 14-288.21. Willfully ignore warning in a disaster. A person is guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor if: (a) (1) There is a disaster as defined by G.S. 166-4; A warning is issued by a federal, State, or local law enforcement (2) agency, emergency management agency, or other governmental agency responsible for emergency management under G.S. 166A-5, 166A-7, or 166A-8 regarding personal safety; The person willfully ignores the warning: (i) to engage in an activity or (3) course of action that a reasonable person would not pursue, or (ii) fails to take a course of action that a reasonable person would pursue; As a result places himself or herself or another in danger; and (4)

1	(5) A governmental rescue effort is undertaken on the endangered person's
2	behalf.
3	(b) A person who violates subsection (a) of this section is civilly liable to any
4	governmental agency conducting a rescue on the endangered person's behalf for the cost
5	of the rescue effort."
6	Section 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 1997, and applies to
7	offenses committed on or after that date.
