In the case of 9 property insurance rates under this Article, consideration shall be given 10 to the insurance public protection classifications of fire districts, which classifications shall be established and modified from time to time by 11 the Commissioner." 12 13 Section 3. There is appropriated from the Department of Insurance Fund established in G.S. 58-6-25 to the Department of Insurance the sum of one hundred fifty 14 thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2000-2001 fiscal year for the expenses of establishing 15 and modifying the insurance public protection classifications of fire districts as provided 16 17 in G.S. 58-36-10(3) and G.S. 58-40-25(4).

Section 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2000.
