		prope	lled; airplane; or other conveyance except that the use of vehicles

		a.	As hunting stands, subject to the following limitations. No wild	
			animal or wild bird may be taken from any vessel under sail,	
			under power, or with the engine running or while still in motion	
			from such propulsion. No wild animal or wild bird may be taken	
			from any vehicle if it is in motion, the engine is running, or the	
			passenger area of the vehicle is occupied. The prohibition of	
			occupying the passenger area of a vehicle does not apply to a	
			disabled individual whose mobility is restricted.	
		b.	For transportation incidental to the taking.	
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1	(2)	With the use or aid of any artificial light, net, trap, snare, electronic or
2		recorded animal or bird call, or fire, except as may be otherwise
3		provided by statute[;] provided, however, that crows may be taken with
4		the aid of electronic calling devices. No wild birds may be taken with
5		the use or aid of salt, grain, fruit, or other bait, except as may be otherwise
6		provided by statute. and no wild birds may be taken from an area in
7		which bait has been placed until the expiration of 10 days after the bait
8		has been consumed or otherwise removed. No bear or wild boar may be
9		taken with the use or aid of any salt, salt lick, grain, fruit, honey, sugar-
10		based material, animal parts or products, or other bait. bait, and no bear
11		or wild turkey may be taken from an area in which bait has been placed
12		until the expiration of 10 days after the bait has been consumed or
13		otherwise removed. The taking of wild animals and wild birds with
14		poisons, drugs, explosives, and electricity is governed by G.S. 113-261,
15		G.S. 113-262, and Article 22A of this Subchapter. Any person who
16		unlawfully takes bear or wild boar with the use or aid of any type of bait
17		is punishable as provided by G.S. 113-294(c). G.S. 113-294(c1)."

19	"(d) Any	violation of this Subchapter or of any rule adopted by the Wildlife
20	Resources Com	mission under the authority of this Subchapter which is subject to a
21	penalty greater	than the one provided in G.S. 113-135(a)(1) is a suspension offense.

A conviction of any other suspension offense results in a suspension for a period of one year."
