AS COMPENSATION FOR THEIR LOSSES, PURSUANT TO THE TOBACCO RELATED SETTLEMENT AND AGREEMENTS WITH **TOBACCO** MANUFACTURERS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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- Section 1. G.S. 105-134.6(b) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "(15) The amount paid to the taxpayer during the taxable year directly or indirectly from one of the following sources to compensate the taxpayer for harm done to the tobacco industry as a result of tobacco litigation. federal tobacco legislation, or reduced purchases of tobacco by tobacco manufacturers:
 - The Settlement Reserve Fund created in G.S. 143-16.4. a.
- The nonprofit corporation created pursuant to consent decree in b. the State v. Philip Morris settlement.

3	Section 2. G.S. 105-130.5(b) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
4	"(18) The amount paid to the taxpayer during the taxable year directly or
5	indirectly from one of the following sources to compensate the taxpayer
6	for harm done to the tobacco industry as a result of tobacco litigation
7	federal tobacco legislation, or reduced purchases of tobacco by tobacco
8	manufacturers:
