2	AN ACT TO CODIFY THE JOINT RESOLUTION DEDICATING PROPERTIES AS
3	PART OF THE STATE NATURE AND HISTORIC PRESERVE, INCLUDING
4	THE CODIFICATION OF NAME CHANGES OF CERTAIN LANDS
5	PREVIOUSLY ACCEPTED INTO THE STATE NATURE AND HISTORIC
6	PRESERVE; TO REMOVE CERTAIN LANDS FROM THE STATE NATURE
7	AND HISTORIC PRESERVE; TO CODIFY THESE REMOVALS; AND TO
8	DELETE CERTAIN LANDS FROM THE STATE PARKS SYSTEM.
	Whereas, Article XIV, Section 5 of the North Carolina Constitution authorizes the
	dedication of State and local government properties as part of the State Nature and
	Historic Preserve upon acceptance by resolution adopted by a vote of three-fifths of the
	members of each house of the General Assembly and removal of properties from that
	Preserve by law adopted by three-fifths of the members of each house of the General
	Assembly; Now, therefore,
9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
10	Section 1. The following parcels of tracts of land are removed, pursuant to

Article XIV, Section 5 of the North Carolina Constitution, from the State Nature and 11 Historic Preserve: 12

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All lands and waters as follows: The portion of that certain tract or (1) parcel of land at Eno River State Park in Durham County, Lebanon 14

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Township, described in Deed Book 1626-854, and more particularly described in a Department of Transportation drawing entitled "Sketch Showing a Portion of the Property of the State of North Carolina, Division of Parks and Recreation, Durham County Project 8.1351301 ID# U-2102 for tracts 155, 158, 159, and 163"; the portion of that certain tract or parcel of land at Eno River State Park in Durham County, Lebanon Township, described in Deed Book 1945-773 and more particularly described in a Department of Transportation drawing entitled "Sketch Showing a Portion of the Property of the State of North Carolina, Division of Parks and Recreation, Durham County Project 8.1351301 ID# U-2102 for tracts 155, 158, 159, and 163"; and the certain parcels or tracts of land in Durham and Orange Counties identified as tracts I, II, III, and IVA on the George C. Love, Jr. survey entitled "Plat Prepared for Acquisition of Zener Forest for Eno River State Park" dated December 2, 1993, and revised December 14, 1993.

- 16 (2)All lands and waters as follows: The portion of that certain tract or property at Hanging Rock State Park in Stokes County, Danbury 17 18 Township, described in Deed Book 360, Page 160, that is a 30-foot 19 wide right-of-way beginning approximately 183 feet south of SR 1001 20 and extending in a southerly direction approximately 1,479 feet and 21 more particularly shown on a survey titled, "J. Spot Taylor Heirs, Danbury Township, Stokes County, N.C."by Grinski Surveying 22 Company, June 1985, as extending from the southwest corner of the 23 24 Bobby Joe Lankford tract.
- All lands and waters as follows: The portion of that certain tract or 25 (3) property at South Mountains State Park in Burke County, Lower Creek 26 27 Township, described in Deed Book 862, Page 1471 for the new right-ofway for SR 1904 needed for the relocation of this road within the park 28 29 and as described in the drawing and shown as between the Rutherford 30 Electric Membership Corporation right-of-way and the southern property boundary dated January 28, 1999, entitled "Survey for State of 31 North Carolina"file name 12455.dwg by Suttles Surveying P.A.; and the 32 33 portions of those certain tracts or property at South Mountains State Park in Burke County, in Upper Fork Township described in Deed Book 34 35 860, Page 341 and Deed Book 884, Page 1641 that are south of the centerline of the CCC road and shown on the drawing entitled "Land 36 Trade Between South Mountains State Park and Adjacent Game Land 37 38 Along CCC Road"by the Division of Parks and Recreation dated March 39 15, 1999. 40
  - Section 2. G.S. 143-260.10 reads as rewritten:

#### "§ 143-260.10. Components of State Nature and Historic Preserve. 41

42 The following are components of the State Nature and Historic Preserve accepted by the North Carolina General Assembly pursuant to G.S. 143-260.8: 43

Umstead State 19 (2)Park as of April 4, 1989, April 6, 1999, with the exception of Tract 20 21 Number 65, containing 22.93140 acres as shown on a survey prepared 22 by John S. Lawrence (RLS) and Bennie R. Smith (RLS), entitled 'Property of The State of North Carolina William B. Umstead State 23 24 Park', dated January 14, 1977, and as removed from the State Nature 25 and Historic Preserve by Chapter 450, Section 1 of the 1985 Session Laws. The tract excluded from the State Nature and Historic Preserve 26 under this subdivision is deleted from the State Parks System in 27 accordance with G.S. 113-44.14. The State of North Carolina may only 28 29 exchange this land for other land for the expansion of William B. 30 Umstead State Park or sell and use the proceeds for that purpose. The 31 State of North Carolina may not otherwise sell or exchange this land. All lands within the boundaries of Jockey's Ridge State Park as of April 32 (3)33 4, 1989, with the exception of the following tract: That certain tract or 34 parcel of land at Jockey's Ridge State Park in Dare County, Nags Head 35 Township, more particularly described as follows: Beginning at an iron rod which is located North 39°07'08"West 74.96 feet from an iron pipe 36
- 36rod which is located North 39°07'08"West 74.96 feet from an iron pipe37having a NC Coordinate value of X-2996057.363 and Y-823796.892,38said iron rod also being located in a common property line between the39State of North Carolina and R. M. Ritchie, et al.; thence running from40said beginning point South 39°07'08"East 10 feet to a point; thence41North 49°10'51"East 47.98 feet to a point in the right-of-way of U.S.42158 Bypass; thence northwesterly along the aforementioned right-of-43way 10 feet to an iron rod; thence South 49°10'51"West 47.98 feet to

7		Stanly County, North Albemarle Township, containing 0.303 acres,
8		more or less, as surveyed and platted by Thomas W. Harris R.L.S., on a
9		map dated August 27, 1988, reference to which is hereby made for a
10		more complete description. The tract excluded from the State Nature
11		and Historic Preserve under this subdivision is deleted from the State
12		Parks System in accordance with G.S. 113-44.14.
13	(5)	All lands within the boundaries of Pettigrew State Park as of April 4,
14		1989, with the exception of the following tract: The portion of that
15		certain tract or parcel of land at Pettigrew State Park in Washington
16		County, Scuppernong Township, described in Deed Book 257, page

18		right-of-way.

27		from the State Parks System in accordance with G.S. 113-44.14. The
28		State of North Carolina may only exchange this land for other land for
29		the expansion of Crowders Mountain State Park or sell this land and use
30		the proceeds for that purpose. The State of North Carolina may not
31		otherwise sell or exchange this land.

37		#12 through #19 on the survey by Dudley and Zeh, R.L.S. dated

40		accordance with G.S. 113-44.14.

42	~ /	Park as of April 4, 1989, April 6, 1999, with the exception of the
43		following tract: The portion of that certain tract or parcel of land at

2		described as parcel 33-02 in Deed Book 633-193, and more particularly
3		described as all of the land in this parcel lying to the west of the eastern
4		edge of the Air Bellows Gap Road as shown on the National Park
5		Service Land Status Map 33 dated 3/24/81, containing approximately 72
6		acres. The tract excluded from the State Nature and Historic Preserve
7		under this subdivision is deleted from the State Parks System in

6	Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
