1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT ADULT CARE HOMES AND NURSING HOMES
3	ENSURE THAT RESIDENTS AND EMPLOYEES ARE IMMUNIZED AGAINST
4	INFLUENZA VIRUS AND THAT RESIDENTS ARE ALSO IMMUNIZED
5	AGAINST PNEUMOCOCCAL DISEASE.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. Effective September 1, 2000, Article 1 of Chapter 131D of the
8	General Statutes is amended by adding the following new section to read:
9	"§ 131D-9. Immunization of residents of adult care homes.
10	(a) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, an adult care home
11	licensed under this Article shall require residents to be immunized against pneumococcal
12	disease.
13	(b) Upon admission, an adult care home shall notify the resident of the
14	immunization requirements of this section and shall request that the resident agree to be
15	immunized against pneumococcal disease.
16	(c) An adult care home shall document the immunization against pneumococcal
17	disease for each resident. Upon finding that a resident is lacking the immunization, or if
18	the adult care home is unable to verify that the individual has received the required
19	immunization, the adult care home shall provide or arrange for immunization. The

immunization and documentation required shall occur not later than November 30 of 1 2 each year. 3 (d) For an individual who becomes a resident of the adult care home after 4 November 30 but before March 30 of the following year, the adult care home shall 5 determine the individual's status for the immunization required under this section, and if 6 found to be deficient, the adult care home shall provide the immunization. 7 No individual shall be required to receive vaccine under this section if the (e) vaccine is medically contraindicated, or if the vaccine is against the individual's religious 8 9 beliefs, or if the individual refuses the vaccine after being fully informed of the health 10 risks of not being immunized. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Health Services 11 (f)Commission shall have the authority to adopt rules to implement the immunization 12 requirements of this section." 13 14 Section 2. Effective September 1, 2001, G.S. 131D-9, as enacted by Section 1 15 of this act. reads as rewritten: "§ 131D-9. Immunization of employees and residents of adult care homes. 16 17 (a) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, an adult care home 18 licensed under this Article shall require residents and employees to be immunized annually against influenza virus and shall require residents to also be immunized against 19 20 pneumococcal disease. 21 (b) Upon admission, an adult care home shall notify the resident of the immunization requirements of this section and shall request that the resident agree to be 22 23 immunized against influenza virus and pneumococcal disease. 24 An adult care home shall notify every employee of the immunization (b1) requirements of this section and shall request that the employee agree to be immunized 25 against the influenza virus. 26 An adult care home shall document the annual immunization against influenza 27 (c)virus and the immunization against pneumococcal disease for each resident.-resident and 28 29 each employee, as required under this section. Upon finding that a resident is lacking the 30 immunization, one or both of these immunizations or that an employee has not been immunized against influenza virus, or if the adult care home is unable to verify that the 31 32 individual has received the required immunization, the adult care home shall provide or 33 arrange for immunization. The immunization and documentation required shall occur not later than November 30 of each year. 34 For an individual who becomes a resident of or who is newly employed by the 35 (d) adult care home after November 30 but before March 30 of the following year, the adult 36 care home shall determine the individual's status for the immunization-immunizations 37 38 required under this section, and if found to be deficient, the adult care home shall provide 39 the immunization. 40 No individual shall be required to receive vaccine under this section if the (e) vaccine is medically contraindicated, or if the vaccine is against the individual's religious 41 42 beliefs, or if the individual refuses the vaccine after being fully informed of the health risks of not being immunized. 43

1	(f) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Health Services
2	Commission shall have the authority to adopt rules to implement the immunization

4	(g) As used in this section, 'employee' means an individual who is a part-time or
5	full-time employee of the adult care home."
6	Section 3. Effective September 1, 2000, Part A of Article 6 of Chapter 131E of
7	the General Statutes is amended by adding the following new section to read:
8	"§ 131E-113. Immunization of residents.
9	(a) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, a nursing home licensed
10	under this Part shall require residents to be immunized against pneumococcal disease.
11	(b) Upon admission, a nursing home shall notify the resident of the immunization
12	requirements of this section and shall request that the resident agree to be immunized
13	against pneumococcal disease.
14	(c) A nursing home shall document the immunization against pneumococcal
15	disease for each resident. Upon finding that a resident is lacking the immunization, or if
16	the nursing home is unable to verify that the individual has received the required
17	immunization, the nursing home shall provide or arrange for immunization. The
18	immunization and documentation required shall occur not later than November 30 of
19	each year.
20	(d) For an individual who becomes a resident of the nursing home after November
21	<u>30 but before March 30 of the following year, the nursing home shall determine the</u>
22	individual's status for the immunization required under this section, and if found to be
23	deficient, the nursing home shall provide the immunization.
24	(e) <u>No individual shall be required to receive vaccine under this section if the</u>
25	vaccine is medically contraindicated, or if the vaccine is against the individual's religious
26	beliefs, or if the individual refuses the vaccine after being fully informed of the health
27	<u>risks of not being immunized.</u> (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Health Services
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29 30	Commission shall have the authority to adopt rules to implement the immunization
31	requirements of this section." Section 4. Effective September 1, 2001, G.S. 131E-113, as enacted by Section
32	3 of this act, reads as rewritten:
33	"§ 131E-113. Immunization of <u>employees and</u> residents.
34	(a) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, a nursing home licensed
35	under this Part shall require residents <u>and employees</u> to be immunized against <u>influenza</u>
36	virus and shall require residents to also be immunized against pneumococcal disease.
37	(b) Upon admission, a nursing home shall notify the resident of the immunization
38	requirements of this section and shall request that the resident agree to be immunized
39	against influenza virus and pneumococcal disease.
40	(b1) <u>A nursing home shall notify every employee of the immunization requirements</u>
41	of this section and shall request that the employee agree to be immunized against
42	influenza virus.

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1	(c) A nursing home shall document the <u>annual immunization against influenza</u>
2	virus and the immunization against pneumococcal disease for each resident. resident and
3	each employee, as required under this section. Upon finding that a resident is lacking one
4	or both of these immunizations or that an employee has not been immunized against
5	influenza virus, the immunization, or if the nursing home is unable to verify that the
6	individual has received the required immunization, the nursing home shall provide or
7	arrange for immunization. The immunization and documentation required shall occur not
8	later than November 30 of each year.
9	(d) For an individual who becomes a resident of <u>or who is newly employed by the</u>
10	nursing home after November 30 but before March 30 of the following year, the nursing
11	home shall determine the individual's status for the immunization-immunizations required
12	under this section, and if found to be deficient, the nursing home shall provide the
13	immunization.
14	(e) No individual shall be required to receive vaccine under this section if the
15	vaccine is medically contraindicated, or if the vaccine is against the individual's religious
16	beliefs, or if the individual refuses the vaccine after being fully informed of the health
17	risks of not being immunized.
18	(f) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Health Services
19	Commission shall have the authority to adopt rules to implement the immunization
20	requirements of this section.
21	(g) As used in this section, 'employee' means an individual who is a part-time or
22	full-time employee of the nursing home."
23	Section 5. The Department of Health and Human Services shall make available
24	to nursing homes and adult care homes educational and informational materials
25	pertaining to vaccinations required under this act.
26	Section 6. G.S. 130A-29(c) is amended by adding the following new
27	subdivision to read:
28	"(9) <u>Implementing immunization requirements for adult care homes as</u>
29	provided in G.S. 131D-9 and for nursing homes as provided in G.S.
30	<u>131E-113.</u> "
31	Section 7. This act is effective when it becomes law.
