A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT MALE RESIDENTS AGE 18 THROUGH 25

COMPLY WITH THE SELECTIVE SERVICE SYSTEM'S REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS BEFORE A LICENSE OR IDENTIFICATION CARD MAY

BE ISSUED BY THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 2 of Chapter 20 is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 20-9.2. Selective service system registration requirements.

- (a) Any male United States citizen or immigrant who is at least 18 years of age but less than 26 years of age shall be registered in compliance with the requirements of Section 3 of the 'Military Selective Service Act', 50 U.S.C. App. 451, et seq., when applying for or renewing a drivers license or identification card.
- (b) The Division shall forward in an electronic format the necessary personal information required for registration to the Selective Service System of the applicants identified in subsection (a) of this section. The applicant's submission of the application for a drivers license or identification card indicates that the applicant has already registered with the Selective Service or that he is authorizing the Division to forward the necessary information to the Selective Service for registration. The Division shall notify the applicant, on the application, that his submission of an application for a drivers license or identification card serves as his consent to be registered with the Selective Service System, if required by federal law.
- (c) This section shall apply to male United States citizens or immigrants under age 26 who are applying for the issuance, renewal, or duplicate of a drivers license, a commercial drivers license, or an identification card."

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 2001.
