A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DIVISION OF FACILITY SERVICES TO STUDY AND REEVALUATE THE MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR LOCAL CONFINEMENT FACILITIES TO PROVIDE FOR IMPROVED FIRE PROTECTION FOR STAFF AND INMATES AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO IMPLEMENT THAT STUDY.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. The Division of Facility Services of the Department of Health and Human Services shall study and reevaluate the minimum standards for local confinement facilities developed by the Division pursuant to G.S. 153A-221 and make the necessary revisions to those standards to provide for improved fire protection for inmates housed in those facilities and the staff supervising them. The revised standards shall ensure that local confinement facilities meet modern fire safety standards, including:

- (1) Properly operating smoke detectors that are checked on a sufficiently frequent basis;
- (2) Fire evacuation plans and staffs that are well-trained in implementing those plans;
- (3) Sprinkler systems and smoke ventilation systems sufficient to suppress the effects of a fire while inmates are being evacuated;
- (4) Electronic doors that allow staff to release inmates from remote locations in the event of fire or other emergency; and
- (5) Staffing standards sufficient to provide the continuous supervision necessary to respond in the event of a fire or other emergency.

SECTION 2. In designing a schedule for the enforcement of the revised minimum standards for local confinement facilities established pursuant to Section 1 of this act, the Division of Facility Services shall be sensitive to the time and costs involved in upgrading or retrofitting older facilities.
