A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO EXTEND THE PILOT PROGRAM FOR INSPECTION OF ANIMAL
WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS BY THE DIVISION OF SOIL AND
WATER CONSERVATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND
NATURAL RESOURCES, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL
REVIEW COMMISSION.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 SECTION 1. Section 15.4(a) of S.L. 1997-443, as amended by Section 3.1
 9 of S.L. 1999-329 and Section 5 of S.L. 2001-254, reads as rewritten:

10 "(a) The Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall develop and implement a pilot program to begin no later than 1 November 1997, and to terminate 1 11 September 2002,2003, regarding the annual inspections of animal operations that are 12 subject to a permit under Article 21 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes. The 13 Department shall select two counties located in a part of the State that has a high 14 concentration of swine farms to participate in this pilot program. In addition, Brunswick 15 County shall be added to the program. Notwithstanding G.S. 143-215.10F, the Division 16 of Soil and Water Conservation of the Department of Environment and Natural 17 Resources shall conduct inspections of all animal operations that are subject to a permit 18 19 under Article 21 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes in these three counties at least once a year to determine whether any animal waste management system is causing a 20 violation of water quality standards and whether the system is in compliance with its 21 animal waste management plan or any other condition of the permit. The personnel of 22 23 the Division of Soil and Water Conservation who are to conduct these inspections in 24 each of these three counties shall be located in an office in the county in which that person will be conducting inspections. As part of this pilot program, the Department of 25 Environment and Natural Resources shall establish procedures whereby resources 26 within the local Soil and Water Conservation Districts serving the three counties are 27 used for the quick response to complaints and reported problems previously referred 28

only to the Division of Water Quality of the Department of Environment and Natural
 Resources."

3 SECTION 2. Section 3.3 of S.L. 1999-329, as amended by Section 6 of S.L.
4 2001-254, reads as rewritten:

5 "Section 3.3. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources, in 6 consultation with both the Division of Water Quality and the Division of Soil and Water 7 Conservation, shall submit interim reports no later than 15 October 1999, 15 April 2000, 8 15 October 2000, 15 April 2001, 15 October 2001, and 15 April 2002 and shall submit a 9 final report no later than 15 October 2002 to the Environmental Review Commission 10 and to the Fiscal Research Division. These reports shall indicate whether the pilot program has increased the effectiveness of the annual inspections program or the 11 12 response to complaints and reported problems, specifically whether the pilot program 13 had resulted in identifying violations earlier, taking corrective actions earlier, increasing compliance with the animal waste management plans and permit conditions, improving 14 15 the time to respond to discharges, complaints, and reported problems, improving 16 communications between farmers and Department employees, and any other 17 consequences deemed pertinent by the Department. These reports shall also compare the 18 costs of conducting operations reviews and inspections under the pilot program with the costs of conducting operations reviews and inspections pursuant to G.S. 143-215.10D 19 and G.S. 143-215.10F. The final report shall include a recommendation as to whether to 20 21 continue or expand the pilot program under this act. The Environmental Review Commission may recommend to the 2003 General Assembly whether to continue or 22 23 expand the pilot program under this act and may make any related legislative 24 proposals."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
