14		give sufficient illumination under normal atmospheric conditions and
15		on a level road to render clearly discernible a person 75 feet ahead,

18		persons in front of the vehicle: Provided, that vehicle.
19	<u>(3)</u>	at At all times times, as required in G.S. 20-129 G.S. 20-129, at least
20		two lights shall be displayed on the front of and on opposite sides of
21		every motor vehicle other than a motorcycle, road roller, road
22		machinery, or farm tractor.
23	<u>(4)</u>	When beams are tilted or lowered, or when low-beam headlamps are
24		used pursuant to subdivision (1) of this subsection, no more than two
25		other factory-installed lights shall be illuminated to the front of the
26		vehicle. All lights installed after original purchase of the vehicle that
27		are aimed forward shall be extinguished so as to minimize the glaring
28		or dazzling white light projected at the oncoming driver."
