27		used pursuant to subdivision (1) of this subsection, no more than two	
28		other factory-installed lights shall be illuminated to the front of the

1	are aimed forward shall be extinguished so as to minimize the glaring
2	or dazzling white light projected at the oncoming driver."
3	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2001.
