| 11 | " <u>§ 163.140.3. Butterfly ballots.</u>   |
| 12 | No ballot may have two parallel sets of columns with some of the parties in one          |
| 13 | column and the other parties in the second column."                                      |
| 14 | <b>SECTION 3.</b> Section 1 of this act becomes effective when it becomes law,           |
| 15 | and applies to elections conducted on or after that date except in the counties, and the |
| 16 | municipalities located therein, of: Cabarrus, Duplin, Forsyth, McDowell, Mitchell,       |
| 17 | Onslow, Vance, and Watauga. Section 1 of this act becomes effective in those counties    |
| 18 | and municipalities when federal, State, or applicable local funds are appropriated to    |

replace the punch-card systems in use. Nothing in this act shall obligate the GeneralAssembly to appropriate funds to implement this act. Section 2 of this act is effective
