4	The General As	ssembly of North Carolina enacts:			
5	SEC	TION 1. The General Assembly finds that:			
6	(1)	The Cape Fear River is formed by the confluence of the Deep and Haw			
7		Rivers in Chatham County and flows generally southeast, past			
8		Fayetteville, Elizabethtown, and Wilmington, to enter the Atlantic			
9		Ocean at Southport after a course of about 200 miles.			
10	(2)	The Cape Fear River and its tributaries are an invaluable natural			
11		resource available to the citizens of North Carolina, providing			
12		freshwater for business and residential uses, routes for waterborne			
13		transportation, various recreational opportunities, and critical wildlife			
14		and fisheries habitats.			
15	(3)	A series of locks and dams makes the Cape Fear River navigable from			
16		Wilmington to Fayetteville. In the 18th and early 19th Centuries,			
17		Scottish settlers immigrated to the Cape Fear River region and had a			
18		significant influence on the development of southeastern North			
19		Carolina.			
20	(4)	A State aquarium in the Fayetteville area, developed in conjunction			
21		with Fayetteville State University, Fayetteville Technical Community			
22		College, the Fayetteville City Council, and the Cumberland County			
23		Commissioners, could offer area history, environmental education, and			
24		nature studies to the public. These institutions, through the aquarium,			
25		could also cooperate with the nonprofit Cape Fear River Assembly to			
26		pursue scientific study and economic analysis necessary to develop			
27		policies for proper management of the Cape Fear River and the river			
28		basin.			

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources the sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year for planning for a proposed Cape Fear River Aquarium to be developed in cooperation with Fayetteville State University, Fayetteville Technical Community College, the Fayetteville City Council, the Cumberland County Commissioners, and the Cape Fear River Assembly. In addition to promoting an awareness, understanding, and appreciation of the diverse natural and cultural resources associated with the Cape Fear River basin, the purpose of the aquarium will be to monitor and study the conditions and status of the river basin and to advise the General Assembly of its findings and recommendations.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001.
