Article 7 of Chapter 131E of the General Statutes reads as 5 6 rewritten: "Article 7. 7 8 "Regulation of Ambulance Emergency Medical Services. 9 "§ 131E-155. Definitions. 10 As used in this Article, unless otherwise specified: 'Ambulance' means any privately or publicly owned motor vehicle, 11 (1)aircraft, or vessel that is specially designed, constructed, or modified 12 and equipped and is intended to be used for and is maintained or 13 14 operated for the transportation of patients on the streets or highways, 15 waterways or airways of this State of persons who are sick, injured, wounded, or otherwise incapacitated or helpless. 16 Repealed by Session Laws 1997-443, s. 11A.129C. 17 (2)18 (3) 'Ambulance EMS provider' means an individual, a firm, corporation or 19 association who which engages in or professes to engage in the 20 business or service of transporting patients in an ambulance. provide 21 emergency medical services. 'Commission' means the North Carolina Medical Care Commission. 22 (4) 23 'Emergency medical dispatcher' means an (5) emergency 24 telecommunicator who has completed an educational program 25 approved by the Department and has been credentialed as an emergency medical dispatcher by the Department. 26 'Emergency medical services' means all services rendered in 27 (6) 28 responding to improve the health and wellness of the community and

8	perform specified emergency medical care skills.

10	(a) No person, firm, corporation, or association shall furnish, operate, conduct,		
11	maintain, advertise, or otherwise engage in or profess to be engaged in the business or		
12	service of treating provide emergency medical services or transporting transport patients		
13	upon the streets or highways, waterways, or airways in North Carolina unless a valid		
14	Ambulance EMS Provider License has been issued by the Department.		
15	(b) Before an Ambulance EMS Provider License may be issued, the person, firm,		
16	corporation, or association seeking the license shall apply to the Department for this		
17	license. Application shall be made upon forms and according to procedures established		
18	by the Department. Prior to issuing an original or renewal Ambulance EMS Provider		
19	License, the Department shall determine that the applicant meets all requirements for		
20	this license as set forth in this Article and in the rules adopted under this Article.		
21	Ambulance EMS Provider Licenses shall be valid for a period specified by the		
22	Department, provided that the period shall be a minimum of four years unless action is		
23	taken under subsection (d) of this section.		
24	(c) The Commission shall adopt rules setting forth the qualifications required for		
25	obtaining or renewing an Ambulance EMS Provider License.		
26	(d) The Department may deny, suspend, amend, or revoke an Ambulance EMS		
27	Provider License in any case in which where the Department finds that there has been a		
28	substantial failure to comply with the provisions of this Article or the rules adopted		
29	under this Article. The Department's decision to deny, suspend, amend, or revoke an		
30	Ambulance EMS Provider License may be appealed by the applicant or licensee		
31	pursuant to the provisions of Article 3 of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, the		
32	Administrative Procedure Act.		
33	(e) Operating as an ambulance <u>EMS</u> provider without a valid Ambulance <u>EMS</u>		
34	Provider License is a Class 3 misdemeanor. Each day's operation as an ambulance EMS		
35	provider without a license is a separate offense.		
36	"§ 131E-156. Permit required to operate ambulance.		
37	(a) No person, firm, corporation, or association, either as owner, agent, provider,		
38	or otherwise, shall furnish, operate, conduct, maintain, advertise, or otherwise engage in		
39	or profess to be engaged in the business or service of transporting patients upon the		
40	streets or highways, waterways or airways in North Carolina unless a valid permit from		
41	the Department has been issued for each ambulance used in the business or service.		
42	(b) Before a permit may be issued for a vehicle to be operated as an ambulance,		

42 (b) Before a permit may be issued for a venicle to be operated as an ambulance,
43 the ambulance <u>EMS</u> provider must <u>shall</u> apply to the Department for an ambulance
44 permit. Application shall be made upon forms and according to procedures established

1 by the Department. Prior to issuing an original or renewal permit for an ambulance, the 2 Department shall determine that the vehicle for which the permit is issued meets all 3 requirements as to equipment, design, supplies and sanitation as set forth in this Article and in the rules of the Commission and that the ambulance EMS provider has the 4 5 certified credentialed personnel necessary to operate the ambulance in accordance with 6 this Article. Permits issued for ambulances shall be valid for a period specified by the 7 Department, not to exceed one year. four years. 8 (c) Duly authorized representatives of the Department may issue temporary 9 permits for vehicles not meeting required standards for a period not to exceed 60 days, when it determines the public interest will be served. 10 11 When a permit has been issued for an ambulance as specified by this Article. (d) 12 the vehicle and records relating to the maintenance and operation of the vehicle shall be open to inspection by duly authorized representatives of the Department at all 13 reasonable times. 14 15 "§ 131E-157. Standards for equipment; inspection of equipment and supplies 16 required for ambulances. The Commission shall adopt rules specifying equipment, sanitation, supply 17 (a) and design requirements for ambulances. 18 19 (b) The Department shall inspect each ambulance for compliance with the 20 requirements set forth by the Commission and this Article when it deems an inspection 21 is necessary. The Department shall maintain a record of the inspection. Upon a determination, based upon an inspection, that an ambulance fails to 22 (c) 23 meet the requirements of this Article or rules adopted under this Article, the Department 24 may suspend deny, suspend, or revoke the permit for the ambulance concerned until 25 these requirements are met. 26 "§ 131E-158. Certified Credentialed personnel required. Every ambulance when transporting a patient shall be occupied at a minimum 27 (a) 28 by all of the following: 29 (1) At least one emergency medical technician who shall be responsible 30 for the medical aspects of the mission prior to arrival at the medical facility, assuming no other individual of with higher certification or 31 32 license credentials is available; and available. 33 One medical responder who is responsible for the operation of the (2)34 vehicle and rendering assistance to the emergency medical technician. 35 An ambulance owned and operated by a licensed health care facility that is used solely to transport sick or infirm patients with known nonemergency medical conditions 36 between facilities or between a residence and a facility for scheduled medical 37 38 appointments is exempt from the requirements of this subsection. The Commission shall adopt rules setting forth exemptions to the 39 (b) requirements stated in (a) of this section applicable to situations where exemptions are 40 41 considered by the Commission to be in the public interest. 42 "§ 131E-159. Credentialing requirements Requirements for certification. An individual seeking certification credentials as an emergency medical 43 (a)

44 technician or technician, emergency medical technician-defibrillation, emergency

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1 medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-paramedic, mobile 2 intensive care nurse, emergency medical services-physician assistant, or emergency 3 medical services-nurse practitioner medical responder shall apply to the Department using forms prescribed by that agency. The Department's representatives shall examine 4 5 the applicant for emergency medical technician by written and practical examination 6 and the applicant for medical responder by either written and written, practical, or written and practical examination. The Department shall issue a certificate appropriate 7 credentials to the applicant who meets all the requirements set forth in this Article and 8 9 the rules adopted for this Article and who successfully completes the examinations required for certification credentialing. Emergency medical technician and technician, 10 11 medical responder responder, emergency medical dispatcher, emergency medical 12 technician-defibrillation, emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-paramedic, mobile intensive care nurse, emergency medical 13 services-physician assistant, and emergency medical services-nurse practitioner 14 certificates credentials shall be valid for a period not to exceed four years and may be 15 renewed after reexamination if the holder meets the requirements set forth in the rules of 16 the Commission. The Department is authorized to revoke or suspend a certificate these 17 credentials at any time it determines that the holder no longer meets the qualifications 18 prescribed for emergency medical technicians or for medical responders. 19

(b) The Commission shall adopt rules setting forth the qualifications required for
certification credentialing of medical responders and responders, emergency medical
technicians. technicians, emergency medical technician-defibrillation, emergency
medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-paramedic, emergency
medical dispatcher, mobile intensive care nurse, emergency medical services-physician
assistant, and emergency medical services-nurse practitioner.

26 An individual currently certified credentialed as an emergency medical (b1)(c) 27 technician-technician, emergency medical technician-defibrillation, emergency medical 28 technician-intermediate, and emergency medical technician-paramedic by the National 29 Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians or by another state where the education/certification education/credentialing requirements have been approved for 30 legal recognition by the Department of Health and Human Services, in accordance with 31 32 rules promulgated by the Medical Care Commission, and who is either currently residing in North Carolina or affiliated with a permitted ambulance EMS provider 33 34 offering service within North Carolina, may be eligible for certification credentialing as 35 an emergency medical technician without examination. This certification credentialing 36 shall be valid for a period not to exceed the length of the emergency medical technician-37 defibrillation, emergency medical technician-intermediate, and emergency medical 38 technician-paramedic applicant's original certification credentialing or four years, 39 whichever is less.

40 (d) An individual currently credentialed as an emergency medical dispatcher by a 41 national credentialing agency, or by another state where the education/credentialing 42 requirements have been approved for legal recognition by the Department of Health and 43 Human Services, in accordance with rules issued by the Medical Care Commission, and 44 who is either currently residing in North Carolina or affiliated with an emergency

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1	medical dispatcher program approved by the Department of Health and Human Services		
2	offering service within North Carolina, may be eligible for credentialing as an		
3	emergency medical dispatcher without examination. This credentialing shall be valid for		
4	a period not to exceed the length of the applicant's original credentialing or four years,		
5	whichever is less.		
6	(c)(e) Duly authorized representatives of the Department may issue temporary		
7	certificates credentials with or without examination upon finding that this action will be		
8	in the public interest. Temporary certificates credentials shall be valid for a period not		
9	exceeding 90 days.		
10	(f) The Department may deny, suspend, amend, or revoke the credentials of a		
11	medical responder, emergency medical technician, emergency medical technician-		
12			
13	technician-paramedic, emergency medical dispatcher, emergency medical services-		
14	physician assistant, emergency medical services-nurse practitioner, or mobile intensive		
15	care nurse in any case in which the Department finds that there has been a substantial		
16	failure to comply with the provisions of this Article or the rules issued under this		
17	Article. Prior to implementation of any of the above disciplinary actions, the		
18	Department shall consider the recommendations of the EMS Disciplinary Committee		
19	pursuant to G.S. 143-519. The Department's decision to deny, suspend, amend, or		
20	revoke credentials may be appealed by the applicant or credentialed personnel pursuant		
21	to the provisions of Article 3 of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, the		
22	Administrative Procedure Act.		
23	"§ 131E-160. Exemptions.		
24	The <u>All of the following vehicles are exempt from the provisions of this Article:</u>		
25	(1) Privately owned vehicles not regularly used in the business of		
26	transporting patients; <u>patients.</u>		
27	(2) A vehicle rendering service as an ambulance in case of a major		
28	catastrophe or emergency, when the permitted ambulances based in the		
29	locality of the catastrophe or emergency are insufficient to render the		
30	services required; <u>required.</u>		
31	(3) Any ambulance based outside this State, except that an ambulance		
32	which receives a patient within this State for transportation to a		
33	location within this State shall comply with the provisions of this		
34	Article; Article.		
35	(4) Ambulances owned and operated by an agency of the United States		
36	government; and government.		
37	(5) Vehicles owned and operated by rescue squads chartered by the State		
38	of North Carolina as nonprofit corporations or associations which are		
39	not regularly used to transport sick, injured, wounded or otherwise		
40	incapacitated or helpless persons except as a part of rescue operations.		
41	"§ 131E-161. Violation declared misdemeanor.		
42	It shall be the responsibility of the ambulance EMS provider to ensure that the		
43	ambulance operation complies with the provisions of this Article and all rules adopted		
$\Delta \Delta$	for this Article. Upon the violation of any part of this Article or any rule adopted under		

44 for this Article. Upon the violation of any part of this Article or any rule adopted under

1 authority of this Article, the Department shall have the power to revoke deny, revoke, or 2 suspend the permits of all vehicles owned or operated by the violator. The operation of 3 an ambulance without a valid permit or after a permit has been suspended denied, 4 suspended, or revoked or without an emergency medical technician and medical 5 responder aboard appropriate credentialed staffing as required by G.S. 131E-158, shall 6 constitute a Class 1 misdemeanor." 7 **SECTION 2.** Article 7A of Chapter 131E reads as rewritten: 8 "Article 7A. 9 "Statewide Trauma System Act of 1993. 10 "§ 131E-162. Statewide trauma system. 11 The Department shall establish and maintain a program for the development of a 12 statewide trauma system. The Department shall consolidate all State functions relating 13 to trauma systems, both regulatory and developmental, under the auspices of this 14 program. 15 The Commission shall adopt rules to carry out the purpose of this Article. These 16 rules shall be adopted with the advice of the State Emergency Medical Services 17 Advisory Council and shall include the operation of a statewide trauma registry, 18 statewide educational requirements fundamental to the implementation of the trauma 19 system, system, and The rules adopted by the Commission shall establish guidelines for 20 monitoring and evaluating the system including standards and criteria for the denial, 21 suspension, voluntary withdrawal, or revocation of credentials for trauma center 22 designation. The rules adopted by the Commission shall avoid duplication of reporting and minimize the cost to hospitals or other persons reporting under this act. The Office 23 24 of Emergency Medical Services shall be the agency responsible for monitoring system 25 development, ensuring compliance with rules, and overseeing system effectiveness. 26 With respect to collection of data and educational requirements regarding trauma, 27 rules adopted by the Medical Care Commission shall limit the authority of the 28 Department to hospitals and prehospital Emergency Medical Services providers. 29 Nothing in this Article shall be interpreted so as to grant the Department authority to 30 require private physicians, schools, or universities, except those voluntarily participating 31 in the trauma system, to provide information or data or to conduct educational programs 32 regarding trauma. 33 "§§ 131E-163, 131E-164: Reserved for future codification purposes." 34 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2001.
