A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO MAKE MORE MUNICIPALITIES ELIGIBLE FOR DEVELOPMENT 3 ZONES. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 105-129.3A(a) reads as rewritten: Development Zone Defined. - A development zone is an area comprised of 6 "(a) one or more contiguous census tracts, census block groups, or both in the most recent 7 8 federal decennial census that meets all of the following conditions: 9 Every census tract and census block group in the zone is located in (1) 10 whole or in part within the primary corporate limits of a city municipality with a population of more than 5,0001,000 according to 11 the most recent annual population estimates certified by the State 12 13 Planning Officer. It has a population of 1,000 or more according to the most recent 14 (2) annual population estimates certified by the State Planning Officer. 15 More than twenty percent (20%) of its population is below the poverty 16 (3) level according to the most recent federal decennial census. 17 Every census tract and census block group in the zone meets at least 18 (4) one of the following conditions: 19 20 More than ten percent (10%) of its population is below the a.
