**SECTION 1.** Article 5 of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

## "§ 163-41.2. Discharge of precinct official unlawful.

- (a) No employer may discharge or demote any employee because the employee has been appointed as a precinct official, or is serving as a precinct official.
- (b) Any employer who violates any provision of this section shall be liable in a civil action for reasonable damages suffered by an employee as a result of the violation, and an employee discharged or demoted in violation of this section shall be entitled to be reinstated to that employee's former position. The burden of proof shall be upon the employee.
- (c) The statute of limitations for actions under this section shall be one year pursuant to G.S. 1-54.
- 18 (d) As used in this section, 'precinct official' has the same meaning as in G.S. 19 163-41(a)."
- 20 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective August 1, 2001.
