8	"(b)	It sha	all be a Class I felony for any person to possess or carry,	whether openly	
9	or concealed, any gun, rifle, pistol, or other firearm of any kind on educational property				
10	or to a curricular or extracurricular activity sponsored by a school. <u>Unless the conduct is</u>				
11	covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, any person				
12	who willfully discharges a firearm of any kind on educational property is guilty of a				
13	Class F felony. However, this subsection does not apply to a BB gun, stun gun, air rifle,				
14	or air pistol."

17	the possession or carrying of a firearm so long as both of the following apply:
