10	or to a curricular or extracurricular activity sponsored by a school. Unless the conduct is		
11	covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, any person		
12	who willfully discharges a firearm of any kind on educational property is guilty of a		
13	Class F felony. However, this subsection does not apply to a BB gun, stun gun, air rifle,		
14	or air pistol."
