## SESSION LAW 2004-198 HOUSE BILL 1453

## AN ACT TO MAKE IT A CLASS F FELONY TO DISCHARGE A FIREARM ON EDUCATIONAL PROPERTY, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE CORRECTIONS, CRIME CONTROL, AND JUVENILE JUSTICE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 14-269.2(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) It shall be a Class I felony for any person to possess or carry, whether openly or concealed, any gun, rifle, pistol, or other firearm of any kind on educational property or to a curricular or extracurricular activity sponsored by a school. <u>Unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, any person who willfully discharges a firearm of any kind on educational property is guilty of a <u>Class F felony</u>. However, this subsection does not apply to a BB gun, stun gun, air rifle, or air pistol."</u>

**SECTION 2.** G.S. 14-269.2(h) reads as rewritten:

"(h) No person shall be guilty of a criminal violation of this section with regard to the possession or carrying of a firearm so long as both of the following apply:

- (1) The person comes into possession of a weapon by taking or receiving the weapon from another person or by finding the weapon.
- (2) The person delivers the weapon, directly or indirectly, as soon as practical to law enforcement authorities."

**SECTION 3.** G.S. 14-269.2(g)(4) reads as rewritten:

- "(g) This section shall not apply to:
  - (4) Weapons used for hunting purposes on the Howell Woods Nature Center property in Johnston County owned by Johnston Community College when used with the written permission of Johnston Community <u>College.College or for hunting purposes on other</u> <u>educational property when used with the written permission of the</u> <u>governing body of the school that controls the educational property.</u>"

**SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2004, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date. In the General Assembly read three times and ratified this the 15<sup>th</sup> day of

July, 2004.
