A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO PERMIT LEFT TURNS ON RED IN CERTAIN SITUATIONS. 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 4 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 20-158(b) reads as rewritten: Control of Vehicles at Intersections. – 5 "(b) 6 When a stop sign has been erected or installed at an intersection, it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to fail to stop in 7 obedience thereto and yield the right-of-way to vehicles operating on 8 the designated main-traveled or through highway. When stop signs 9 have been erected at three or more entrances to an intersection, the 10 driver, after stopping in obedience thereto, may proceed with caution. 11 Vehicles facing a red light controlling traffic passing straight through 12 (2) an intersection from a steady or strobe beam stoplight shall not enter 13 the intersection while the steady or strobe beam stoplight is emitting a 14 red light controlling traffic passing straight through an intersection; 15 provided that, where prohibited by an appropriate sign vehicular traffic 16 facing a red light controlling traffic passing straight through an 17

to a complete stop and unless prohibited by an appropriate sign, that 1 2 approaching vehicle may turn under one of the following conditions: 3 That vehicle may make a right turn. The turning vehicle shall a. yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and to other traffic using 4 5 the intersection. 6 If that vehicle is in the leftmost lane of travel on a one-way b. 7 street that intersects with another one-way street with traffic 8 traveling from the turning driver's right to the turning driver's 9 left, then that vehicle may enter the intersection and make a left 10 turn into the extreme left-hand lane lawfully available to traffic. The turning vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians 11 12 and to other traffic using the intersection. When the a stoplight is emitting a steady yellow circular light on a 13 (2a) 14 traffic signal controlling traffic passing straight through an intersection 15 or a steady yellow arrow light on a traffic signal controlling traffic turning at an intersection, vehicles facing the yellow light are warned 16 17 that the related green light is being terminated or a red light will be 18 immediately forthcoming. When the stoplight is emitting a steady green light, vehicles may proceed with due care through the 19 20 intersection subject to the rights of pedestrians and other vehicles as 21 may otherwise be provided by law. When a flashing red light has been erected or installed at an 22 (3) 23 intersection, approaching vehicles facing the red light shall stop and 24 yield the right-of-way to vehicles in or approaching the intersection. The right to proceed shall be subject to the rules applicable to making 25 a stop at a stop sign. 26 When a flashing yellow light has been erected or installed at an 27 (4) intersection, approaching vehicles facing the yellow flashing light may 28 29 proceed through the intersection with caution, yielding right-of-way to vehicles in or approaching the intersection. 30 When a stop sign, stoplight, flashing light, or other traffic-control 31 (5) 32 device authorized by subsection (a) of this section requires a vehicle to 33 stop at an intersection, the driver shall stop at (i) an appropriately marked stop line, or if none, (ii) before entering a marked crosswalk, 34 35 or if none, (iii) before entering the intersection at the point nearest the intersecting street where the driver has a view of approaching traffic 36 37 on the intersecting street." 38 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2003.
