A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE IN THE SAME MANNER AS FEDERAL LAW THAT A
3 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE ANALOGUE SHALL, TO THE EXTENT
4 INTENDED FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION, BE TREATED AS A
5 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE IN SCHEDULE I OF THE NORTH CAROLINA
6 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT, AND TO PROVIDE THAT THUS MAE 1,
7 4-BUTANDEDIOL, AN ANALOGUE OF GAMMA-HYDROXYBUTRIC ACID
8 (GHB), IS A SCHEDULE I CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE WHEN THE
9 SUBSTANCE IS INTENDED FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION.

10 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

11 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding the
12 following new section to read:

13 **"§ 90-89.1. Treatment of controlled substance analogues.**

14 A controlled substance analogue shall, to the extent intended for human
15 consumption, be treated for the purposes of any State law as a controlled substance in
16 Schedule I."

17 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 90-87 is amended by adding the following new
18 subdivision to read:

19 "(5a) 'Controlled substance analogue' is as defined in subdivision 802(32) of
20 Title 21 of the United States Code."

21 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies to
22 offenses committed on or after December 1, 2003.
