Whereas, most indoor tanning salon bulbs provide a sign	
UVA and UVB radiation, both types of which are found in the outd	loor sun and cause
various types of damage to the skin that may lead to skin cancer; and	
Whereas, past studies have suggested that tanning beds incidence of melanoma, and a recent study in the Journal of the	
Institute indicates that the use of tanning devices may also contribute

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
SECTION 1. Chapter 104E of the General Statutes is a	mended by adding
the following new section to read:	
"§ 104E-9.1. Restrictions on use and operation of tanning equipme	
(a) Operators of tanning equipment and owners of tanning f	
rules adopted pursuant to this Chapter shall comply with or ensure co	ompliance with the

The operator shall provide to each consumer a warning statement that

defines the potential hazards and consequences of exposure to

1			ultraviolet radiation. Before allowing the consumer's initial use of the
2			tanning equipment, the operator shall obtain the signature of the
3			consumer on the warning statement acknowledging receipt of the
4			warning.
5		<u>(2)</u>	The operator shall not allow a person younger than the age of 18 years
6			to use tanning equipment unless the person gives the operator a written
7			informed consent statement signed and dated by the person's parent or
8			legal guardian and sworn before a notary public stating that the parent
9			or legal guardian has read and understands the warnings given by the
10			tanning facility, consents to the minor's use of the tanning equipment,
11			and agrees that the minor shall use protective eyewear.
12		<u>(3)</u>	The operator shall not allow a person younger than the age of 13 years
13			to use tanning equipment unless:
14			a. The tanning facility receives written permission from the
15			person's physician allowing the person to use the tanning
16			equipment, and
17			b. The person's parent or legal guardian remains at the tanning
18			facility while the person uses the tanning equipment.
19		<u>(4)</u>	The operator shall not allow a person 13, 14, or 15 years of age to use
20			tanning equipment unless the person's parent or legal guardian remains
21			at the tanning facility while the person uses the tanning equipment.
22		(5)	Neither an operator nor an owner shall claim or distribute promotional
23			materials that claim that using tanning equipment is safe or free from
24			risk or that using tanning equipment will result in medical or health
25			benefits.
26		<u>(6)</u>	The operator shall not allow a person to use tanning equipment longer
27			than the recommended exposure time provided by the manufacturer of
28			the tanning equipment as shown on the label of the tanning equipment.
29	<u>(b)</u>	The C	Commission may adopt and the Department shall enforce rules to
30	impleme	nt this	section. The requirements of this section are in addition to other rules
31	adopted	pursuai	nt to this Chapter that are applicable to tanning facilities and do not
32	conflict v	with thi	s section.
33	<u>(c)</u>	As us	ed in this section, unless the context requires otherwise, the term:
34		<u>(1)</u>	'Consumer' means any individual who is provided access to a tanning
35			facility that is subject to registration and regulation under this Chapter.
36		<u>(2)</u>	'Tanning facility' means any location, place, area, structure, or business
37			that provides consumers access to tanning equipment. For the purpose
38			of this definition, tanning equipment registered to different persons at
39			the same location and tanning equipment registered to the same
40			person, but at separate locations, shall constitute separate tanning
41			facilities.
42		<u>(3)</u>	'Tanning equipment' means ultraviolet or other lamps and equipment
43			containing such lamps intended to induce skin tanning through the

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1	irradiation of any part of the living human body with ultraviolet
2	radiation."
3	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 2003.
