Duke University Medical Center; and
Whereas, Durham is home to two nationally recognized universities, Duke
University and North Carolina Central University; and
Whereas, Durham was recognized as one of the "Best Places to Live" in the
South by Money magazine; and
Whereas, Durham is home to the world-renowned Research Triangle Park;
