12	(a) It is the policy of the State to promote and encourage the use of solar e	nergy.
13	(b) The following definitions apply in this section:	
14	(1) Significantly. – An amount exceeding twenty percent (20%) of	the cost
15	of a solar energy system or decreasing the efficiency of a system	
16	amount exceeding twenty percent (20%), as originally specif	ied and
17	proposed.	
18	(2) Solar energy system A device or structural design fea	ture, a
19	substantial purpose of which is to provide daylight for interior	lighting
20	or to provide for the collection, storage, conversion, and distribution	ution of
21	solar energy for space heating or cooling, water heating, or ele	ectricity
22	generation.	•
23	(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no governing bod	y of a
24	municipality or county shall adopt or enforce an ordinance that effectively probable	
25	unreasonably restricts the installation or use of a solar energy system. Any co	venant,
26	restriction, or other condition contained in any deed, contract, security agreen	
27	other instrument affecting the transfer or sale of any real property or any interest	
28	that effectively prohibits or unreasonably restricts the installation or use of	a solar
29	energy system is void and unenforceable. For purposes of this section, an ordin	ance or

- covenant, restriction, or other condition effectively prohibits or unreasonably restricts the installation or use of a solar energy system if it significantly increases the cost of a solar energy system or significantly decreases the efficiency or expected performance of a solar energy system.
- (d) Whenever approval is required for the installation or use of a solar energy system, the application for approval shall be processed and approved by the approving entity in the same manner as an application for approval of an architectural modification to the property. Approval shall not be willfully avoided or delayed.
- (e) Any person or entity, other than a governing body of a municipality or county, that willfully violates this section shall be liable to the applicant for actual damages resulting from the violation, and the court shall also order the person or entity to pay the applicant a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000). In any action to enforce compliance with this section, the prevailing party shall be awarded costs and reasonable attorneys' fees."

**SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
