The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Article 7 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"<u>§ 14-27.15. Sexual battery.</u>

- (a) <u>Definitions. The following definitions apply in this section:</u>
 - (1) <u>'Intimate parts' means the genital area, groin, anus, inner thighs, buttocks, or breasts.</u>
 - (2) 'Sexual contact' means any contact by a defendant with the intimate parts of a person not married to the defendant for the purpose of sexual gratification of the defendant or for the purpose of degrading or humiliating the person or any contact by a defendant of the intimate parts of the defendant with a person not married to the defendant for the purpose of sexual gratification of the defendant or for the purpose of degrading or humiliating the person.
- (b) Offense. A defendant commits the offense of sexual battery if the defendant intentionally subjects another person to sexual contact.
- (c) Penalty. A defendant convicted of a first offense under this section is guilty of a Class A1 misdemeanor. A defendant convicted of a second or subsequent offense under this section is guilty of a Class I felony."

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2003, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
