PRINCIPAL DEPARTMENT(S) & PROGRAM(S) AFFECTED: Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission, Local ABC Boards					
EFFECTIVE DATE: This act is effective when it becomes law. The Commission and each local ABC board shall be in full compliance with the law no later than six months after the day the bill becomes law.					

BILL SUMMARY: The bill requires the posting of signs in Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) stores warning of the possible dangers of consumption of alcohol during pregnancy.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY: The maximum \$25 fee from each of the state's 400 ABC stores will generate \$10,000. An administrator of the ABC Commission thinks the \$25 fee is more than sufficient to cover the costs of the signs. In fact, the Commission may choose to pay for the signs out of its operating budget rather than bother with collecting fees from the local ABC boards.
