(2		When a steady or strobe beam stoplight steady-beam tratesignal is emitting a red light controlling traffic passing through approaching an intersection, an approaching vehicle facing red light shall come to a stop and shall not enter intersection. After coming to a complete stop and unliprohibited by an appropriate sign, that approaching vehicle make a right turn.  When a vehicle stops at a traffic signal as required unsub-subdivision a. of this subdivision, after coming to complete stop and unless prohibited by an appropriate sign that vehicle is in the leftmost lane of travel on a one-way streat intersects with another one-way street with traffic travel from the turning driver's right to the turning driver's left, that vehicle may enter the intersection and make a left turn in the extreme left-hand lane lawfully available to traffic. The sub-subdivision shall apply only to the following intersection in the City of Raleigh:  1. Salisbury and Jones Streets.  2. Salisbury and Jones Streets.  3. Wilmington and Jones Streets.  4. b. Any vehicle that turns right under this subdivision shall yield 1 2 the right-of-way to: 3 Other traffic and pedestrians using the intersection; and 1. 2. Pedestrians who are moving towards the intersection, 4 5 who are in reasonably close proximity to the intersection, 6 and who are preparing to cross in front of the traffic that 7 is required to stop at the red light. 8 Failure to yield to a pedestrian under this subdivision shall be c. an infraction, and the court may assess a penalty of not more 9 10 than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00). 11 12 d. The Department of Transportation shall collect data regarding 13 the number of individuals who are found responsible for 14 violations failing to yield the right-of-way while turning right at 15 a red light in violation of sub-subdivision b. of this subdivision 16 and the number of pedestrians who are involved in accidents at 17 intersections because of a driver's failure to yield the 18 right-of-way while turning right at a red light. The data shall 19 include information regarding the number of disabled 20 pedestrians, individuals including with visual 21 mobility-related disabilities, who are involved in right turn on red accidents. The Department shall report the data annually to 22 23 the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee beginning January 1, 2006. 24 25 26 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2005, and expires on
