1 A HOUSE RESOLUTION HONORING THE FOUNDER OF THE BOY SCOUTS OF  
2 AMERICA ON THE ORGANIZATION'S SCOUTING ANNIVERSARY WEEK.

3       Whereas, the Boy Scouts of America was officially incorporated by Chicago  
4 publisher, William D. Boyce, on February 8, 1910, and chartered by the United States  
5 Congress on June 15, 1916; and

6       Whereas, the mission of this national youth movement is serving others  
7 through its values-based program; and

8       Whereas, since its founding, the Boy Scouts of America has provided more  
9 than 110 million youth with the support, friendship, and mentoring necessary to live a  
10 happy and fulfilling life; and

11       Whereas, the Boy Scouts of America will be celebrating its Scouting  
12 Anniversary Week during February 6-12, 2005, with the theme "On My Honor,  
13 Timeless Values"; and

14       Whereas, also during this time, the Cub Scouts, a unit of the Boy Scouts of  
15 America, will be celebrating its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary; and

16       Whereas, the Boy Scouts of America deserves recognition and  
17 acknowledgment for its service and dedication to America's youth; Now, therefore,

18 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

19       **SECTION 1.** The House of Representatives honors the memory of William  
20 D. Boyce and congratulates the Boy Scouts of America on its 95<sup>th</sup> anniversary and the  
21 Cub Scouts on its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

22       **SECTION 2.** The Principal Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this  
23 resolution to the National Council of Boy Scouts of America.
