3	PERFORMANCE AUDIT.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. The Legislative Services Commission shall contract for a
6	performance audit of the executive branch of State government and a performance audit
7	of the staff of the legislative branch of State government. The Legislative Services
8	Commission shall report the results of these audits to the 2008 Regular Session of the
9	2007 General Assembly on or before February 1, 2008.
10	The performance audit in the executive branch shall include an examination
11	of the efficiency and effectiveness of major management policies, practices, and
12	functions across all executive branch agencies, including the following areas:
13	(1) Planning, budgeting, and program evaluation policies and practices.
14	(2) Personnel systems operations and management.
15	<ul><li>(3) State purchasing operations and management.</li></ul>
16	(4) Information processing and telecommunications systems policy,
17	organization, and management.
18	(5) Organizational and staffing patterns, especially in terms of the ratio of
19 20	managers and supervisors to nonmanagement personnel.
20	Performance audits in executive branch agencies may examine entire
21 22	departments, agencies, or institutions, or similar programs in several departments. <b>SECTION 2.</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General
22	Assembly the sum of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to
23 24	contract for the performance audits required by this act. These funds shall not revert at
24 25	the end of the 2006-2007 fiscal year but shall remain available for expenditure in the
25 26	2007-2008 fiscal year for the performance audits required by this act.
20 27	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
