6	SECT	FION 1.(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the	
7	Department of I	Health and Human Services the sum of two hundred thousand dollars	
8	(\$200,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year. These funds shall be used as follows:		
9	(1)	Increase public awareness and education about osteoporosis, its	
10		impact, the importance of early diagnosis and appropriate	
11		management, and effective prevention strategies.	
12	(2)	Increase osteoporosis education and outreach to diverse population	
13		groups in North Carolina.	
14	(3)	Increase health and human services professionals' understanding of	
15		osteoporosis, its impact, and the importance of and skill required for	
16		early diagnosis, appropriate management, and effective treatment	
17		strategies.	
18	(4)	Provide access to knowledge on the prevalence, diagnosis, treatment,	
19		and prevention of osteoporosis.	
20	(5)	Improve the diagnosis, treatment, and prevention abilities of health and	
21		human services professionals.	
22	(6)	Reduce barriers to diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of osteoporosis	
23		for all North Carolina citizens.	
24	(7)	Monitor the burden of illness and progress toward preventing	
25 26	(0)	osteoporosis in North Carolina's citizens.	
26	(8)	Evaluate education and awareness as well as efforts to improve diagnosis treatment and provention of estapparesis	
27		diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of osteoporosis.	

SECTION 1.(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that funds for
osteoporosis awareness and education be included in the continuation budget.
SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
