Short Title: Retired School Professionals Return to Work.

1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO ENABLE RETIRED SCHOOL PRINCIPALS, ASSISTANT
3	PRINCIPALS, AND CENTRAL OFFICE ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL TO
4	RETURN TO EMPLOYMENT WITH THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS WITHOUT
5	LOSING RETIREMENT BENEFITS.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 135-3(8)c. reads as rewritten:
8	"c. Should a beneficiary who retired on an early or service
9	retirement allowance under this Chapter be reemployed, or
10	otherwise engaged to perform services, by an employer
11	participating in the Retirement System on a part-time,
12	temporary, interim, or on a fee-for-service basis, whether
13	contractual or otherwise, and if such beneficiary earns an
14	amount during the 12-month period immediately following the
15	effective date of retirement or in any calendar year which
16	exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the reported compensation,
17	excluding terminal payments, during the 12 months of service
18	preceding the effective date of retirement, or twenty thousand
19	dollars (\$20,000), whichever is greater, as hereinafter indexed,
20	then the retirement allowance shall be suspended as of the first
21	day of the month following the month in which the
22	reemployment earnings exceed the amount above, for the
23	balance of the calendar year. The retirement allowance of the
24	beneficiary shall be reinstated as of January 1 of each year
25	following suspension. The amount that may be earned before
26	suspension shall be increased on January 1 of each year by the

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1	ratio of the Consumer Price Index to the Index one year earlier,
2	calculated to the nearest tenth of a percent $(1/10 \text{ of } 1\%)$ .
3	The computation of postretirement earnings of a beneficiary
4	under this sub-subdivision, G.S. 135-3(8)c., who has been
5	retired at least six months and has not been employed in any
6	capacity, except as a substitute teacher or a part time tutor,
7	other substitute employee, with a public school for at least six
8	months immediately preceding the effective date of
9	reemployment, shall not include earnings while the beneficiary
10	is employed to teach on a substitute, interim, or permanent basis
11	in a public school. The Department of Public Instruction shall
12	certify to the Retirement System that a beneficiary is employed
13	to teach by a local school administrative unit under the
14	provisions of this sub-subdivision and as a retired teacher or
15	school administrative personnel as the term is defined under the
16	provisions of G.S. $115C-325(a)(5a)$ .
17	Beneficiaries employed under this sub-subdivision are not
18	entitled to any benefits otherwise provided under this Chapter
19	as a result of this period of employment."
20	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a) reads as rewritten:
21	"(5a) "Retired teacher or school administrative personnel" means a
22	beneficiary of the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System
23	of North Carolina who who:
24	a. Was previously employed as a teacher, principal, assistant
25	principal, or as central office administrative personnel,
26	b. has <u>Has</u> been retired at least six months,
27	<u>c.</u> has <u>Has</u> not been employed in any capacity, other than as a
28	substitute teacher or a part time tutor, teacher or other substitute
29	employee, with a local board of education for at least six
30	months, immediately preceding the effective date of
31	reemployment,
32	e. is Is determined by a local board of education to have had
33	satisfactory performance during the last year of employment by
34	a local board of education or a charter school, and
35	<u>f.</u> who <u>Who</u> is employed to teach as provided in G.S. 135-3(8)c.
36	A retired teacher shall be treated the same as a probationary teacher
37	except that (i) a retired teacher is not eligible for career status and (ii)
38	the performance of a retired teacher who had attained career status
39	prior to retirement shall be evaluated in accordance with a local board
40	of education's policies and procedures applicable to career teachers."
41	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 115C-316(d) reads as rewritten:
42	"(d) A local board of education may pay a retired teacher teachers and retired
43	school administrative personnel, as that term is those terms are defined in

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1	the teacher appropriate salary schedule, excluding longevity, had the employee
2	employees not retired."
3	SECTION 4. Subsection (d) of Section 28.24 of S.L. 1998-212, as rewritten
4	by Section 28.10 of S.L. 2002-126 and by Section 31.18A of S.L. 2004-124, reads as
5	rewritten:
6	"(d) This section becomes effective January 1, 1999, and expires June 30, <del>2005.</del>
7	<u>2006.</u> "
8	SECTION 5. The introductory language of Section 67 of S.L. 1998-217, as
9	rewritten by Section 28.10 of S.L. 2002-126 and by Section 31.18A of S.L. 2004-124,
10	reads as rewritten:
11	"SECTION 67. Effective January 1, 1999, through June 30, <del>2005, 2006,</del>
12	G.S. 135-3(8)c., as rewritten by Section 28.24(a) of S.L. 1998-212 reads as rewritten:".
13	SECTION 6. Subsection (b) of Section 67.1 of S.L. 1998-217, as rewritten
14	by Section 28.10 of S.L. 2002-126 and by Section 31.18A of S.L. 2004-124, reads as
15	rewritten:
16	"(b) This section becomes effective January 1, 1999, and expires June 30, <del>2005.</del>
17	<u>2006.</u> "
18	SECTION 7. Subsection (c) of Section 32.25 of S.L. 2001-424, as rewritten
19	by Section 28.10 of S.L. 2002-126 and by Section 31.18A of S.L. 2004-124, reads as
20	rewritten:
21	"SECTION 32.25.(c) This section becomes effective July 1, 2001, and expires June
22	30, <del>2005.</del> <u>2006.</u> "
23	<b>SECTION 8.</b> This act becomes effective June 30, 2005.
